21-year-old Raeford man charged for abduction, rape

A 21-year-old Raeford man was in jail under \$50,000 bond Tuesday after being charged with first degree burglary, second degree kidnapping and second degree

On Sunday, a victim reported that Floyd Dupree had come into her house and followed her into the bathroom, where she was trying to escape him.

The suspect apparently broke down the bathroom door, and took the victim to a wooded area in West Hoke where he attemped to rape her, Hoke County Sheriff's

reports show.

When she would not comply, Dupree allegedly let her out of the car. She left the scene on foot, but later accepted a ride home with her

alleged attacker, the report said. Early this week Dupree was arrested after being served with warrants charging him with the crimes.

In an unrelated matter, sheriff's reports say that there was \$750 worth of damage done to a car by vandals last Tuesday.
