## Volunteers put in hours to help Hoke schools

Information received from the schools in the Hoke County system shows that volunteers have contributed time and money toward the improvement of education for all the children in the county. The report shows that 692 volunteers have given 5,997 hours of their time to help in the schools. This is an average of 8.67 hours per person. The dollar value of these hours is \$20,089.95 if the minimum hourly wage figure is used. In addition to the time,

\$14,264.00 have been contributed. The week of May 6-12 was designated as Volunteer Appreciation Week. A special volunteer flag will be flown at the Board of Education office during the month of May in recognition of those who have shown a willingness to help improve the Hoke County Educational System.
