Qualls will travel to New York later in the summer to study also, he said.

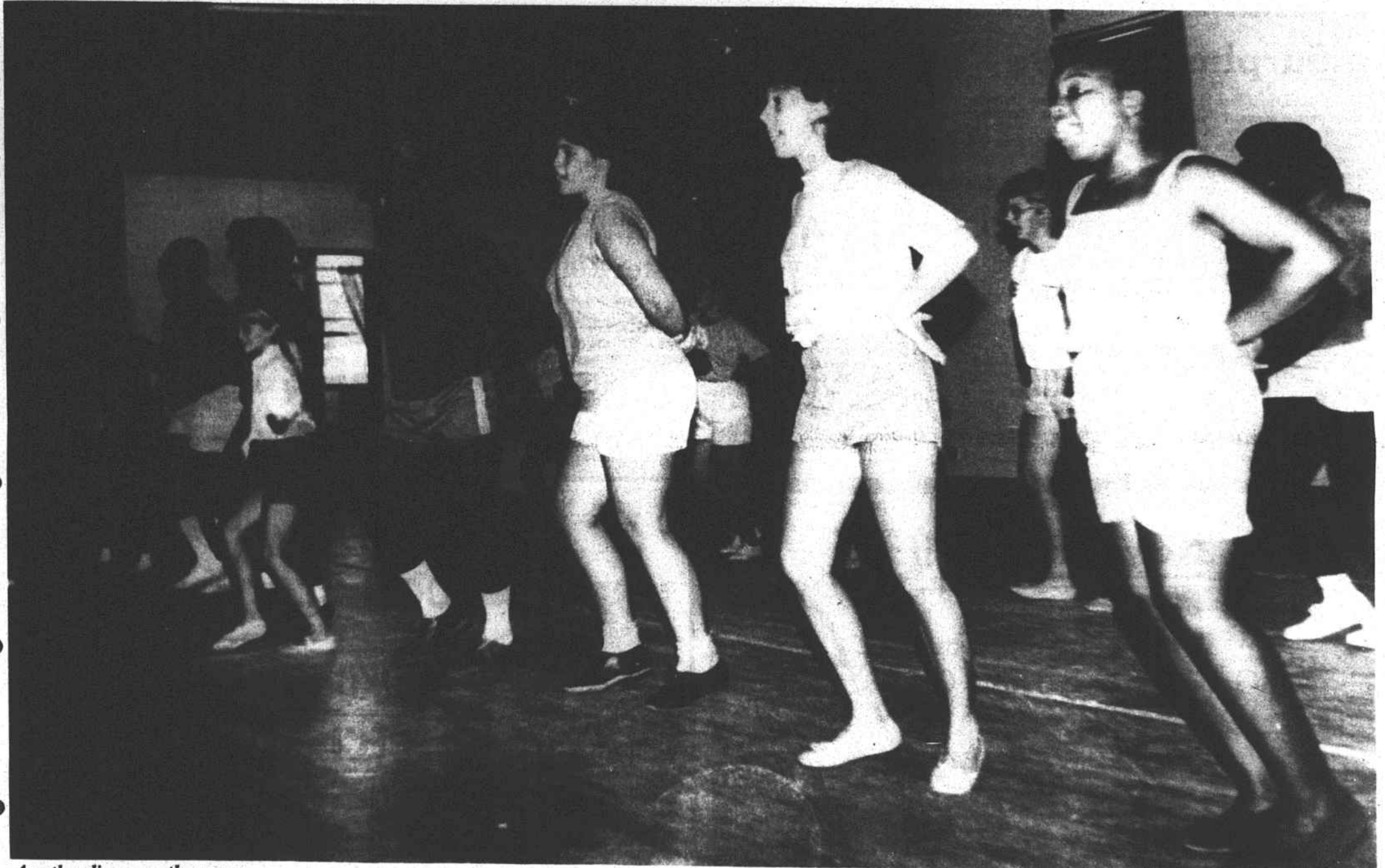
During one of the first rehearsals for the show, Qualls said, as he looked at the stage: "They've only been at this for a week.

Flags too

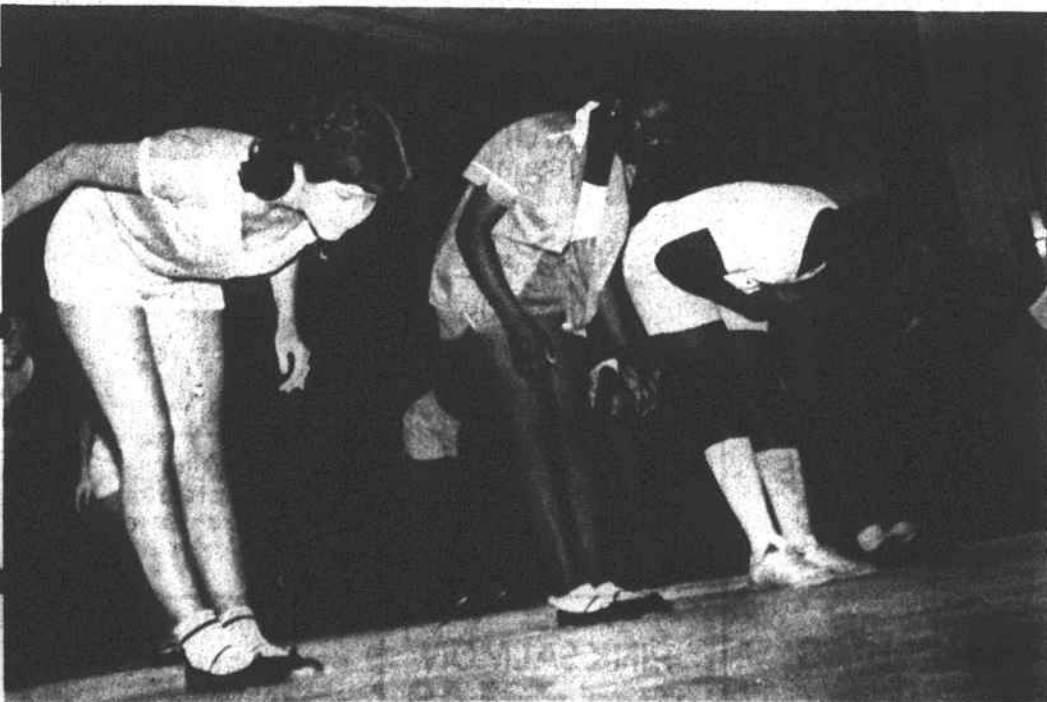
