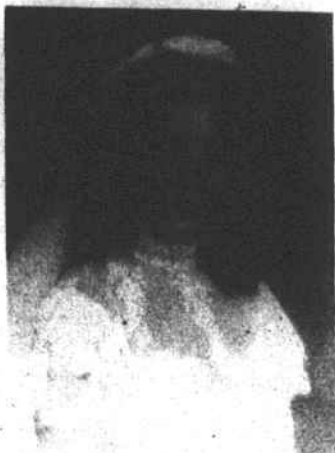
Doris Gosnell, President of the U.S. Jaycee Women organization from Lexington was one of the guest speakers.
