August 1 at 5 p.m. Head Football Coach Tom Jones said that he is looking forward to a good season because of the enthusiasm shown in these early sessions of practice.

Bucks readying for season

Hoke High School will begin football practice on Wednesday, August 1 for the 1984-85 season, said Head Football Coach Tom Jones.

Practice will begin at 5:30 p.m. on that date, but players need to be at Hoke High's McDonald Gym at

5 p.m. for an important meeting, Jones said.

Players should report to practice the first day with football shoes or tennis shoes in case of rain, shorts, a T-shirt, practice socks, a towel and a \$5 athletic fee, the coach said.

One important prerequisite to beginning practice is that every player who shows up must have had a full physical examination before they can participate, Jones said.

Some members of the team have

just finished a week of camp at the high school where they sharpened their reflexes doing various drills and practiced some offensive and defensive plays.

The first game for the Bucks will be on September 7 at South View High School in Fayetteville.

Wood finishes infantry school

Pvt. Gerry B. Wood, son of Kermit L. and Elizabeth T. Wood of N. Fulton Street, Raeford, has completed one station unit training (DSUT) at the U.S. Army Infantry School, Fort Benning, Georgia.

DSUT is a 12-week period which combines basic combat training and advanced individual training.

The training included weapons qualifications, squad tactics, patrolling, landmine warfare, field communications and combat operations. Completion of this course qualifies the soldier as a light-weapons infantryman and as an indirect-fire crewman.

Soldiers were taught to perform any of the duties in a rifle or mortar squad.
