Unemployment rises

unemployment rate in Hoke County climbed again into double-digits during July hitting 10.0%, according to figures released by the state **Employment Security Commission**

Although the rate increased, the figures also show that 60 more county residents were working than the previous month.

The reasons for the increase have been tied to temporary industry layoffs, an increased labor force and wet weather. Hoke County was one of the 22 counties in the state which showed double-

During July, the rate rose from 9.2% recorded in June to the 10% mark, and 80 county residents joined the jobless ranks.

In June there were 780 workers unemployed out of a labor force of 8,500. July's figures show that the work force increased by 140 and 860 workers were jobless.

July's figures also showed that Fayetteville showed a slight in-crease from 7.2% to 7.5%, Moore County rose from 6.6% to 6.9%, Scotland County went from 9.1% to 9.3% and Robeson County went from 9.6 to 10.2%.
