Plant trees soon

Cooler weather also means that it is time to order tree seedlings for planting this winter.

Application forms for forest tree seedlings from state nurseries will be available the first of October, either on request from the Direc tor, N.C. Division of Forest Resources, P.O. Box 27687, Raleigh, NC 27611; or locally from offices of the County Forest Ranger, the Agricultural Extension Service, or the Soil Conservation Service

Applications will be filled by the nurseries in the order they are received, and many species are likely to sell out quickly, so order early. Genetically improved seedl-ings may be limited to a maximum of 100,000 loblolly pine and 50,000 white pines per applicant.

Applications must be at the office of the Division of Forest Resources at least four weeks prior to shipment.

Weather permitting, shipments should start about December 1. Hardwood species are sold in units of 100 seedlings; softwoods

in units of 1,000. There is a \$1.50 delivery charge per thousand for softwoods except

Fraser fir, and \$1.00 per hundred for hardwoods.

For Fraser fir a charge of \$5 per order will cover delivery to County Headquarters.

All Fraser fir is 3-0 bare rooted stock and orders placed in October and November will be filled on a percentage basis as the supply allows.




