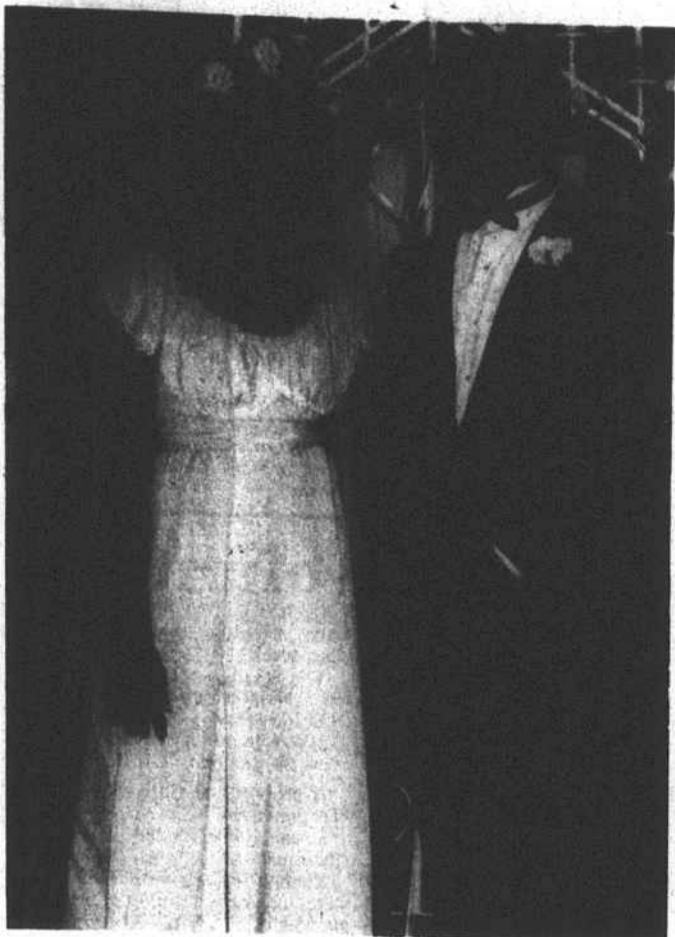

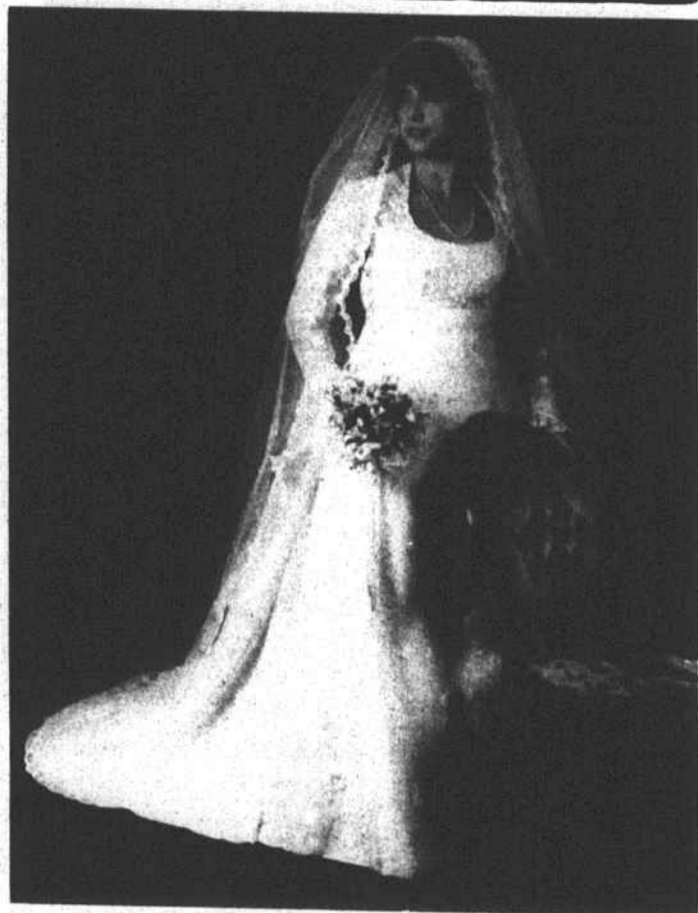
Guests danced to the music of Paul Reichle and his combo of Fayetteville.
