Shannon man jailed for traffic violations

A Shannon man has filed no appeal and has been sent to prison for at least one year after being found guilty in District Court of eight traffic violations.

Dan Collins, 22, was arrested on November 19 and charged with a stop sign violation, not having his car registered, having no inspec-tion sticker, having no insurance on his car, driving while his license was revoked, speeding 80 miles per hour in a 55 zone, driving at least 15 miles per hour over the speed limit while trying to elude a law enforcement officer and failure to stop for a blue light and siren.
