

# DWI cases fill docket in District Court

Twelve drivers were convicted of driving while impaired (DWI) last week in Hoke County District Court.

A Lumberton man, George Allen Locklear, was sentenced to two years in prison after his DWI conviction, records from the Clerk of Courts office say.

Locklear was arrested on the third DWI offense on October 20, according to records.

At the time of his arrest, the 38-year-old man was also charged with driving while his license was revoked, speeding 105 in a 55 zone, speeding more than 15 miles per hour over the limit and failure to stop for a blue light and siren.

Locklear also ran from the arresting officer, records say.

A Fayetteville man was also sentenced to a prison term for DWI and driving while his license was revoked.

James Otis Owens, 30, was given a one year unsuspended prison term after being convicted of the November 8 infraction, records say.

A Dobson man was given a total of six years on supervised probation after being convicted of DWI and driving with a revoked license, records say.

Allen Dale Fowler Sr., 44, was sentenced one year suspended for three years special supervised probation on the DWI offense and two years suspended for three years supervised probation on the revoked license offense, records say.

To accompany the probation, Fowler was fined \$500 for the October 17 DWI offense, records say.

A specification attached to the sentence was that the terms of probation were to run consecutively.

Tommy Bullard, of Maxton, was given two suspended sentences after being convicted of DWI, speeding 90 in a 55 zone, speeding more than 15 miles over the limit, reckless driving, failure to follow the directions of an officer, no registration, no insurance and failure to stop for a blue light and siren, according to records.

For all the offenses except DWI, Bullard was sentenced to no less than 12 but no more than 18 months suspended for two years of supervised probation, records say.

The 19-year-old man was sentenced to six months suspended for two years of unsupervised probation on the DWI charge.

Bullard was fined a total of \$800 for the October 20 charges, records say.

Simeon Wright Adams, of Laurinburg, received a 90-day sentence suspended for one year supervised probation after being convicted of two charges stemming from a November 30 arrest, records say.

Adams was charged with DWI and carrying liquor in his car, according to records.

The 55-year-old man was also fined \$200, records say.

Adams was also charged with failure to stop at the scene of an accident.

He was convicted of the charge and sentenced to six months in jail

suspended for one year supervised probation, records say.

Stanley Bernard Banks, of Mid-dlesex, received a 90 day suspended sentence after being convicted of DWI and driving with his license indefinitely suspended, records say.

The 29-year-old man was also fined \$200 for the December 21 charges.

Dannie DuPree, of Raeford, who was charged with DWI on November 11, was given a six month suspended sentence and fined \$250, records say.

The 50-year-old man was given three years unsupervised probation, records say.

Mary Richardson Ford, of Laurel Hill, was given one year of unsupervised probation and fined \$100 after being convicted of DWI and aiding another to drive while impaired, records say.

Ford, 37, was arrested on August 15, according to records.

Wayne Leroy Johnson, of Fayetteville, was fined \$125 and given one year unsupervised probation after being convicted of a November 17 DWI offense, records say.

Johnson, 29, was also charged with having no driver's license, records say.

James Junior Maynor, of Shannon, received a 120 day sentence suspended for one year unsupervised probation after being convicted of DWI and running a stop sign, records say.

The 20-year-old man was fined \$200 and ordered to perform 72 hours of community service, records say.

De Larry McLean, of Raeford, who was charged on December 9 with DWI and having a wreck causing damage to another's property, was sentenced to 90 days suspended for one year unsupervised probation and fined \$200, records say.

Carlos F. Ramos Perez, driving on a foreign license, was sentenced to 60 days suspended for one year unsupervised probation and fined \$100 after being arrested on November 18, records say.

Perez, 23, was charged with DWI, according to records.

Alexander McNair Legget, 40, of Fayetteville, was given two years supervised probation and fined \$500 after being convicted of charges stemming from a September arrest, records say.

According to records, Legget was charged with failing to stop for a blue light and siren, passing on a curve, reckless driving, 90 in a 55 and speeding 15 miles over the limit on September 19, records say.

In other court action, Barbara Locklear, of Red Springs, was given unsupervised probation and forced to pay \$46.75 in restitution after being charged with writing a bad check to Pepsi Cola, records say.

Phillip Stewart, of Rowland, was arrested on September 8 driving while his license was revoked, according to records.

The 41-year-old man received two years unsupervised probation and a \$200 fine, records say.

A Raeford man, Larry Morrissey, was sentenced to no less than six and no more than nine months suspended for one year supervised probation and fined \$100 for assaulting two women, records say.

The 25-year-old man was convicted of throwing Cynthia Kershaw to the ground and injuring her left arm and twisting the arm of Sylvia Kershaw and throwing her against a brick wall, records say.

Lisa Gaye Poe, of Raeford, received three years on supervised probation after being convicted of stealing "less than \$400" from Donald L. Poe, according to records.

A 16-year-old girl was placed on supervised probation for two years after being convicted of breaking and entering.

Frances Thompson, of Lakeview, was arrested on November 26 after apparently breaking into the home of Abner Lee Strother, records say.

A 34-year-old Raeford man, Raymond Wallace, was sentenced to two years in prison after being convicted of breaking into Jeff Harris' home on December 23, according to records.

Donald Dean Cumming, of Red Springs, was sentenced to 90 days in jail with no suspension after being convicted of possession of marijuana, breaking into and entering a car, and possession of drug paraphernalia, records say.

A warrant was issued for the 38-year-old man on December 28, records say.

Henry Jacobs, 31, of Shannon, was sentenced to six months suspended for two years unsupervised probation, fined \$75 and forced to pay \$69 in restitution after being convicted of assault, records say.

According to records, Jacobs hit Annette Maynor in the head and body, causing bruises.

Jacobs was arrested on a warrant on the last day of 1984.

Ronald McNeill Huffman, of Raeford, was fined \$75 for possession of marijuana, records say.

Huffman, 18, was arrested on September 19, records say.

A Raeford man, arrested in October and charged with three traffic violations, resisting arrest and failure to appear in court, received an 18-month sentence in Hoke County District Court in earlier court action.

Ronald Clarence Morrissey, 24, was stopped for speeding 46 in a 35 mile per hour zone, according to court records.

It was then discovered that Morrissey had no registration on his car and that his license was suspended. Morrissey was also charged with failure to appear for his court date and resisting arrest, records say.

In other court action, a Red Springs man received a six-month jail sentence for displaying a fictitious driver's license.

Neil Allen Buie was arrested on October 31, records say.

Buie is 28, according to records.

A Raeford woman, Creola Wiggins, was given a six month suspended sentence and fined \$75 after being convicted of stealing \$100 from Willie Monroe.

Wiggins was arrested on Christmas day, records say.

There were two convictions of driving while impaired (DWI) in court last week.

John D. Gilmore, of Rex, was given a 90-day suspended sentence and placed on unsupervised probation for one year after being convicted on the September 1 violation, records say.

Gilmore, 31, was also charged with consuming an alcoholic beverage, records say.

Along with the probation, Gilmore was fined \$150, say records.

David Horne was also convicted of DWI.

Charged on September 1, Horne was given a 60-day suspended sentence and fined \$100, records say.
