**TAX INFO** - North Carolina taxpayers having questions when preparing their 1984 Federal income tax returns may use one of several telephone numbers in addition to the toll-free system, the Internal Revenue Service said. The system is called "Tele-Tax" and is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. It offers more than 140 information tapes on subjects including filing requirements, itemized deductions, Social Security taxation, tax credits, types of income and adjustments to income. "Tele-Tax" is available only to owners of push-button telephones, who have a choice of seven numbers to call for taped messages. The number in Fayetteville is 483-0735. These numbers and a listing of tapes by number are included in the tax forms package mailed to individuals and in IRS Publication 910. When one of the numbers is called, a message will be heard giving instructions on how to use the system. THESE ARE NOT TOLL-FREE NUMBERS. BILL Lovelace, Chief of the IRS Taxpayer Service Division, remarked, "Last year we received about 10,000 calls over the "Tele-Tax" system. We highly recommend it for those persons unable to contact us on the toll-free system, or who need tax information during evenings or weekends."
