The wedding is planned for May 4 in Clemmons United Methodist Church of Clemmons.

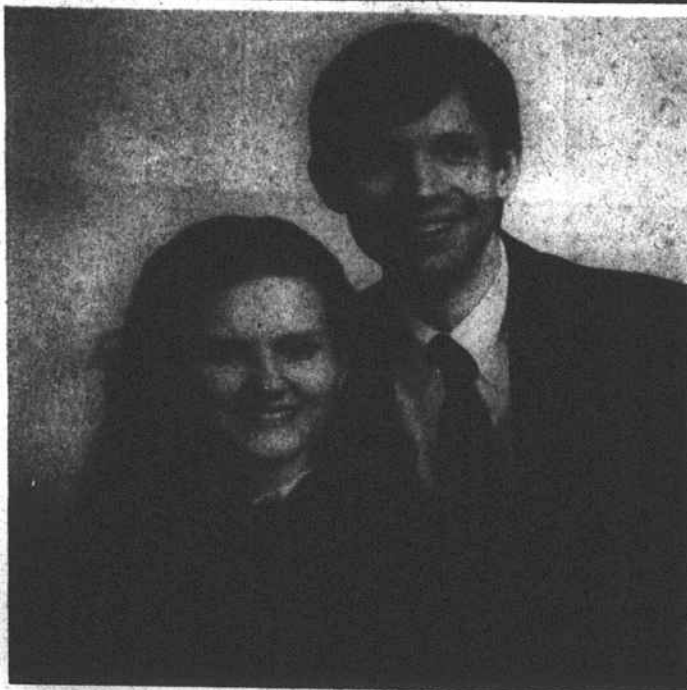
