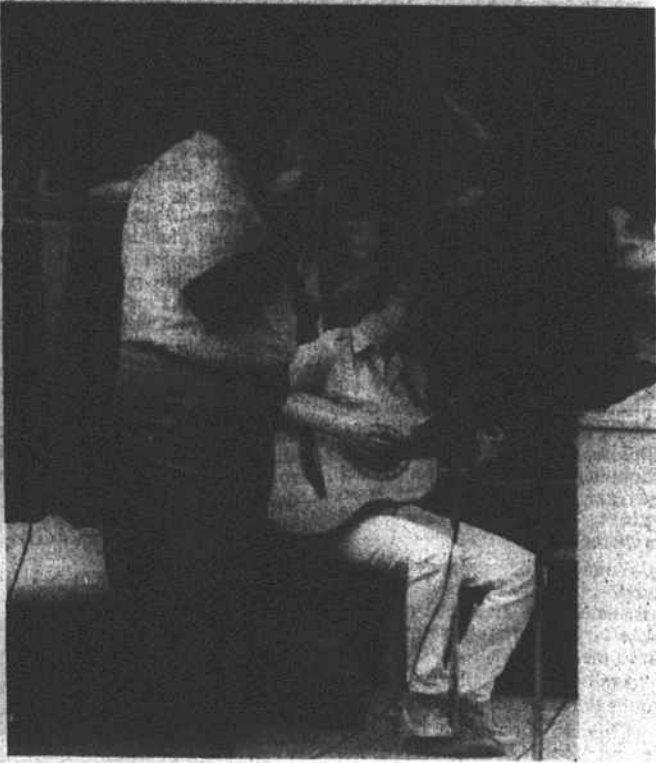
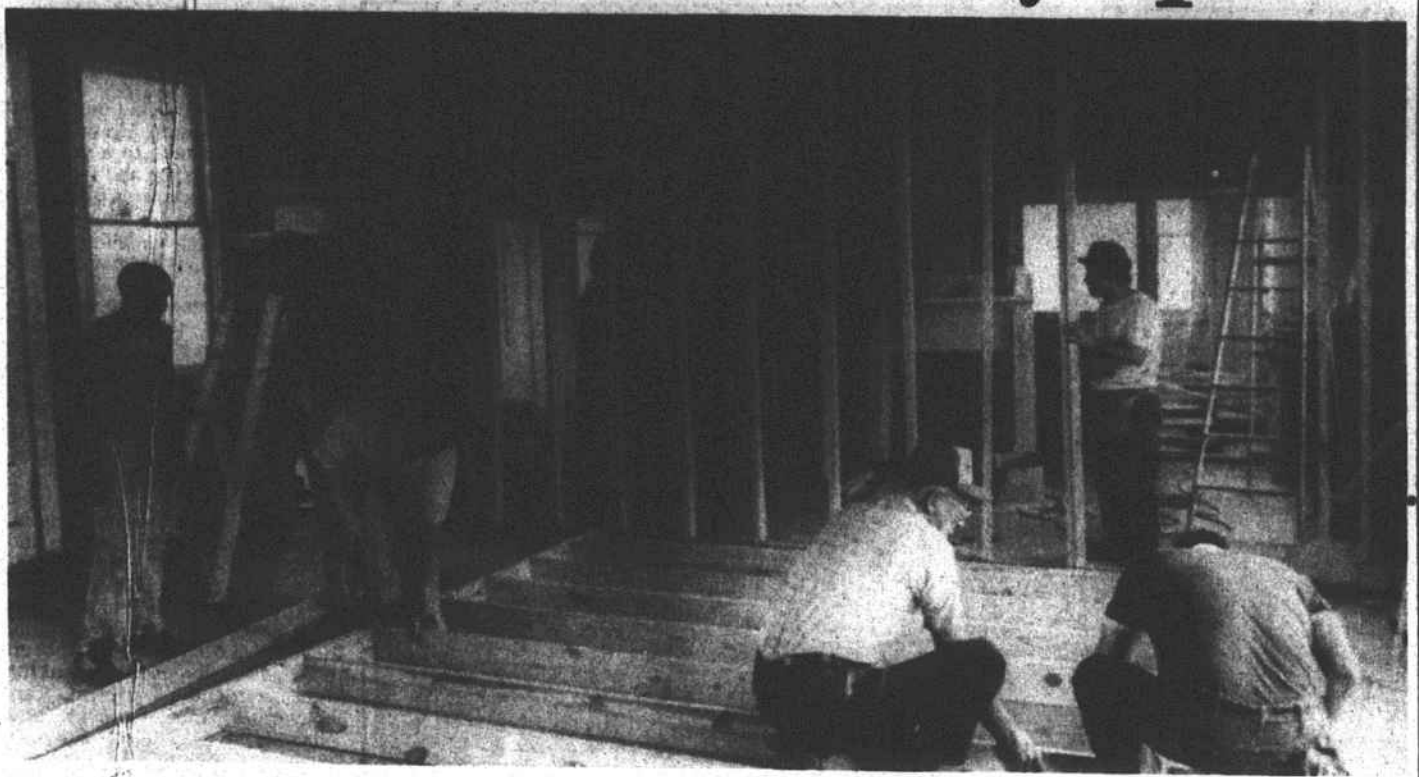


Weekend was one of community spirit

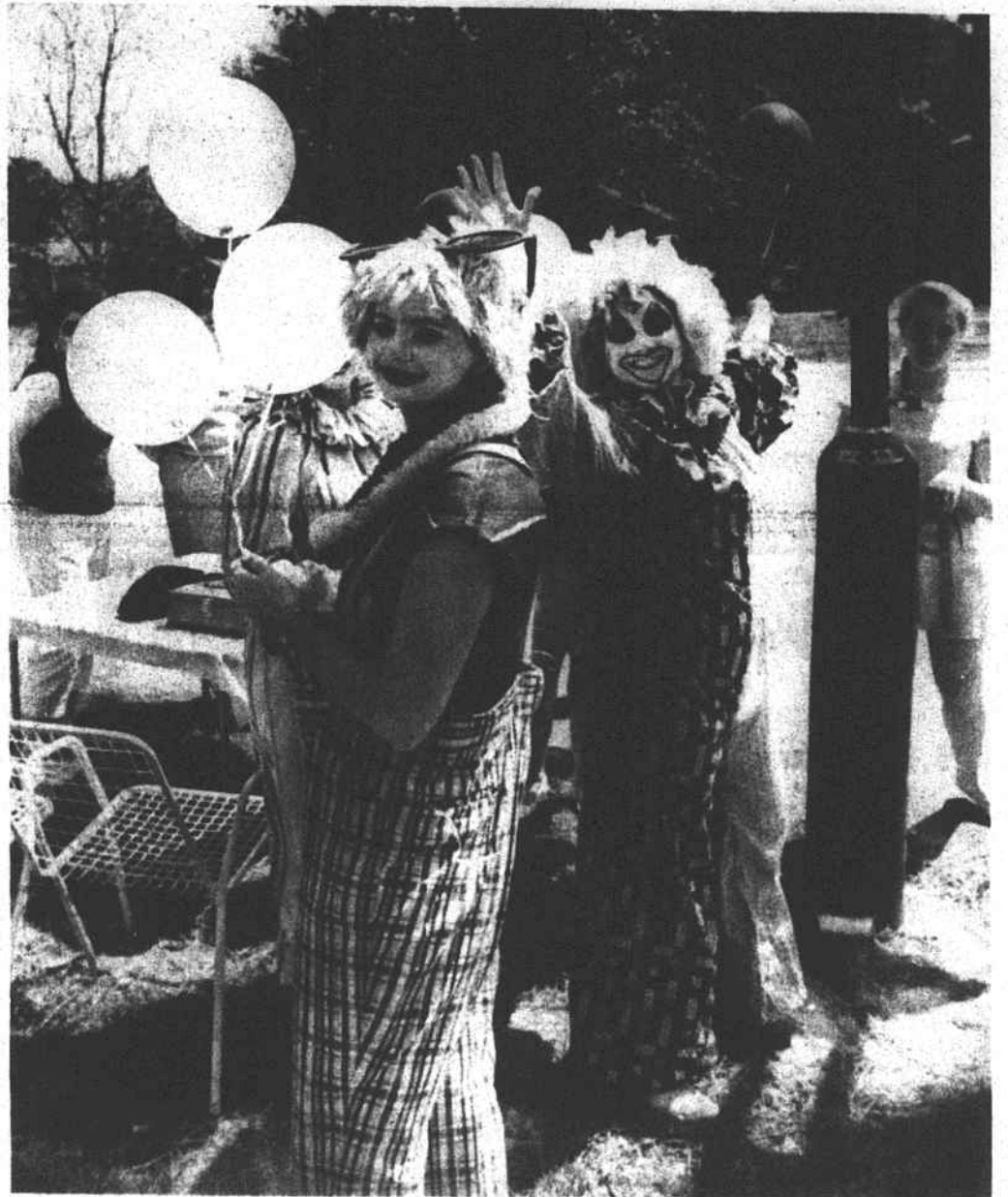
Getting up the wall

son, (left) looks for a dropped nail. Most of the framing on the building was completed, windows were repaired and soffit and fascia replaced during the eight and a half hour community work day.

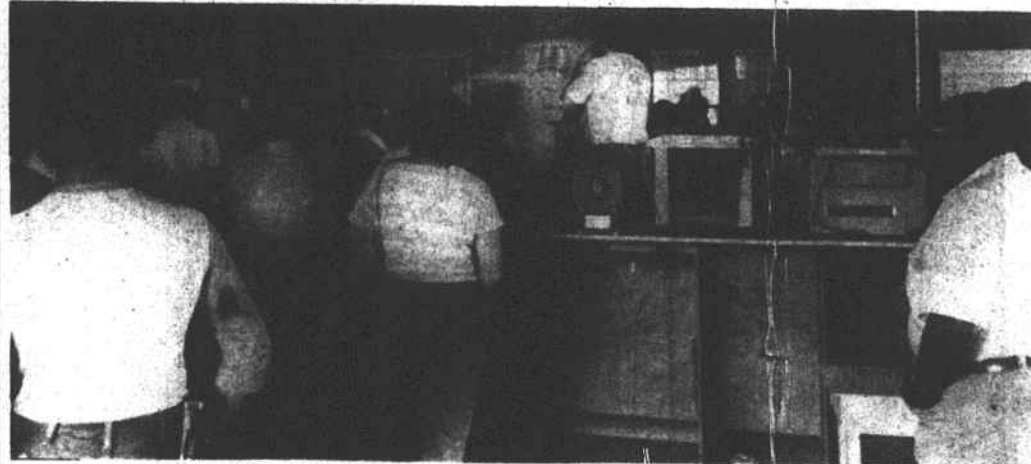


Getting ready for campaigning
