arrangements of fresh spring flowers. Cake squares, mints, nuts, cheese biscuits, and punch were served.

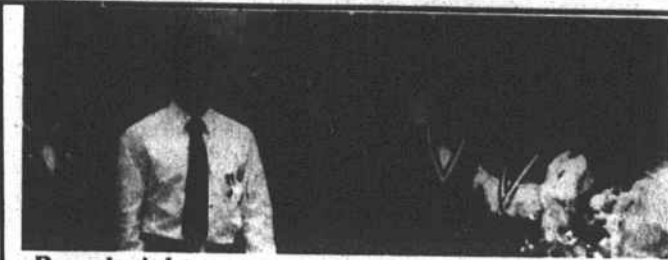
Thirty-five guests came to bring gifts and good wishes. The hostesses gave the bride-elect a set of microwave cookware.
