The wedding was directed by Mrs. Charlotte Davis of Rockingham.

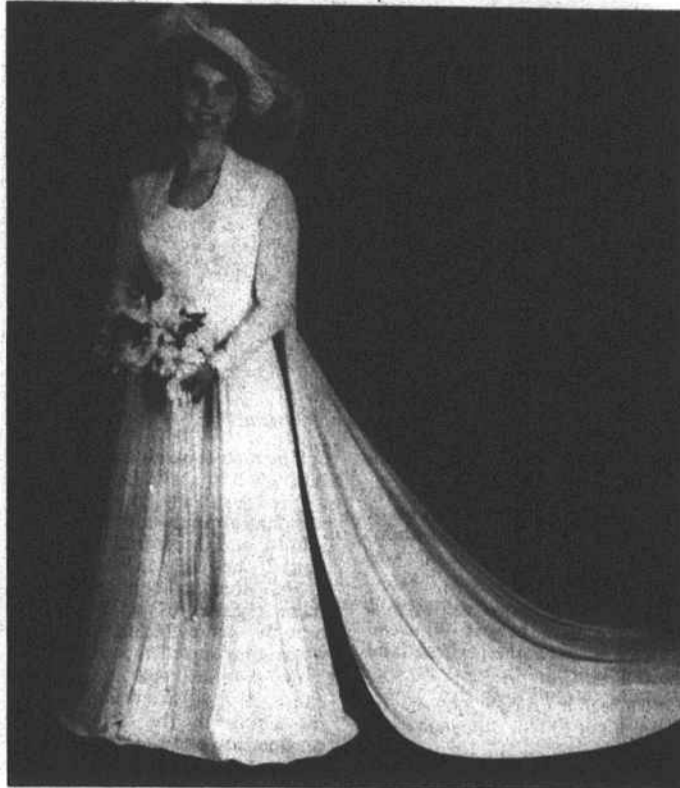
RECEPTION
