Miss Jada Pope, daughter of the bride, was flower girl.

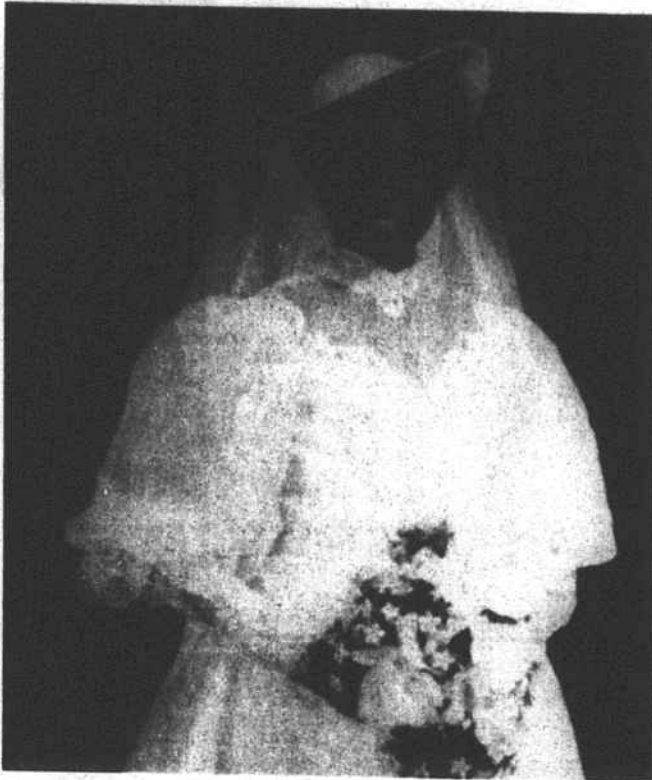
