The runner from Hoke County, rising high school senior Terrell Carpenter, burned the competition up in a meet last Saturday in Towson, Maryland.

Carpenter broke the standing meet record by jumping 25 feet, one-quarter inches in the long jump in the East Coast Invitational Track Meet.

The old record was set by 1984 Olympic gold medalist Carl Lewis. The Raeford resident left for the National Junior Olympics in Seat-

Running with a club out of Raleigh, the East Coast Classics, he will travel across the country to compete.

A west coast speedster, Henry Thomas of Hawthorne, California has posted a time of 10.25 seconds in the same event.


"That scares me," Carpenter has said.

They also beat Arran Lakes 4-2, New Hope Baptist 11-2, Cedar Falls Baptist 15-5 in going undefeated for the day.


