Laurinburg and Southern is ranked 13th in the county with a value of \$1.6 million, which includes the Edenborough Shopping Center in Raeford.

Subsidized housing

Three of the county's subsidized housing projects are ranked in the top 25 taxpayers.

The three projects pay about \$19,000 in taxes and are valued at \$2.43 million.

A fourth project, Lantern Lane. which is located on Highway 211, is under construction and has not been placed on the tax books.

Yadkin Trail Apartments are valued at \$1.19 million and ranks

Countryside Apartments rank 21st with a value of \$653,000, while The Meadows is 25th with an assessment of \$584,000.

Downtown Raeford

If considered as one industry, the downtown Raeford business district would rank as the sixth largest taxpayer in the county with a value of about \$5.1 million.(The collective value does not include the real estate in the Edenborough Shopping Center, which is owned by Laurinburg and Southern Railroad. The value of that property is estimated by the state and not available locally.)

The 49 downtown merchants and businesses pay collectively over \$41,000 in county taxes or about 1.6% of the budgeted ad valorem revenue and almost \$28,000 in Raeford taxes or 4.3% of the collections.


