County sets airport hearing

County Commission Vice-Chairman Neill McPhatter asked if the ordinance would limit any ex-pansion that may be planned in the future for the airport.

"We can't enlarge the airport," Byrd said.

Due to private property surrounding the facility and the Fort Bragg Reservation less than one mile from one end of the runway, there is no place for the airport enlargement, said Byrd.

A public hearing was set for 9 a.m. on September 3 for the ordinance by the county.

According to McFayden, members of the Raeford City Council may also have to set a public hearing date since the airport is jointly owned by the the city and county.

Turkey signs OK'd

During the meeting, a motion was passed to have signs reading "Home of the N.C. Turkey Festival" placed on the same poles but under existing signs welcoming visitors to Hoke County.

The signs will cost between \$25 and \$30, County Manger Cowan estimated.
