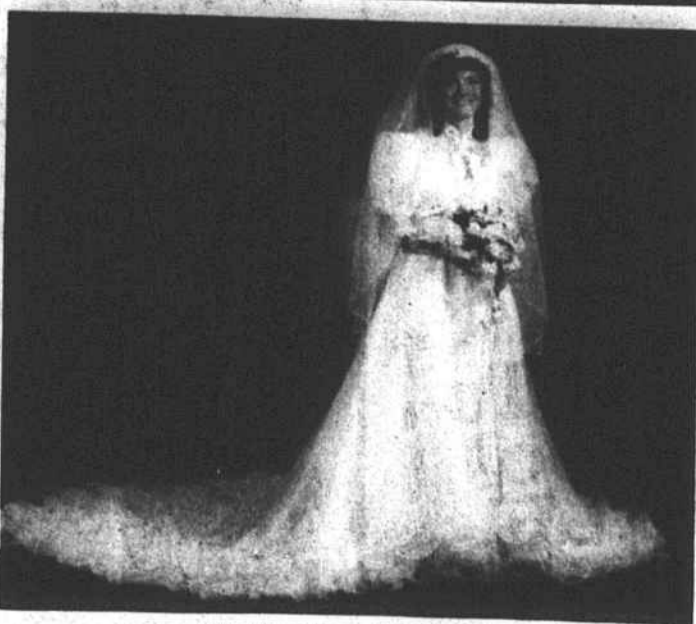
Bridesmaids were Lori Pickler and Nancy Oldham of Raeford. They wore dresses and carried nosegays like those of the maid of honor.
