Guests were greeted by the bridal party in the vestibule of the church following the ceremony.

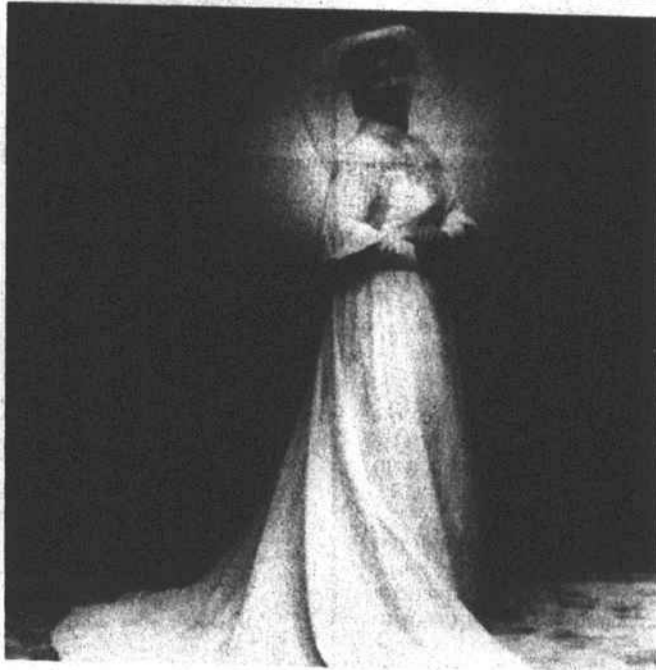
