"There were no marks or bruises on the man," Barrington said. "I'm sure the autopsy report

will show that the man died from strangulation or a broken neck."

"If a man wants to hang himself, you can't be with him all the time," Barrington said.

According to the sheriff, prisoners are checked on the hour each day and every 30-45 minutes at night.

Only one other prisoner has at-tempted suicide in the Hoke County Jail in recent memory.

Barrington said that a few months ago, a man broke a razor and cut his wrists.

Jailers were alerted by other prisoners and the man was given medical care.

Chappelle was to appear in Hoke County District Court on the drunk and disruptive charge on October 31.


