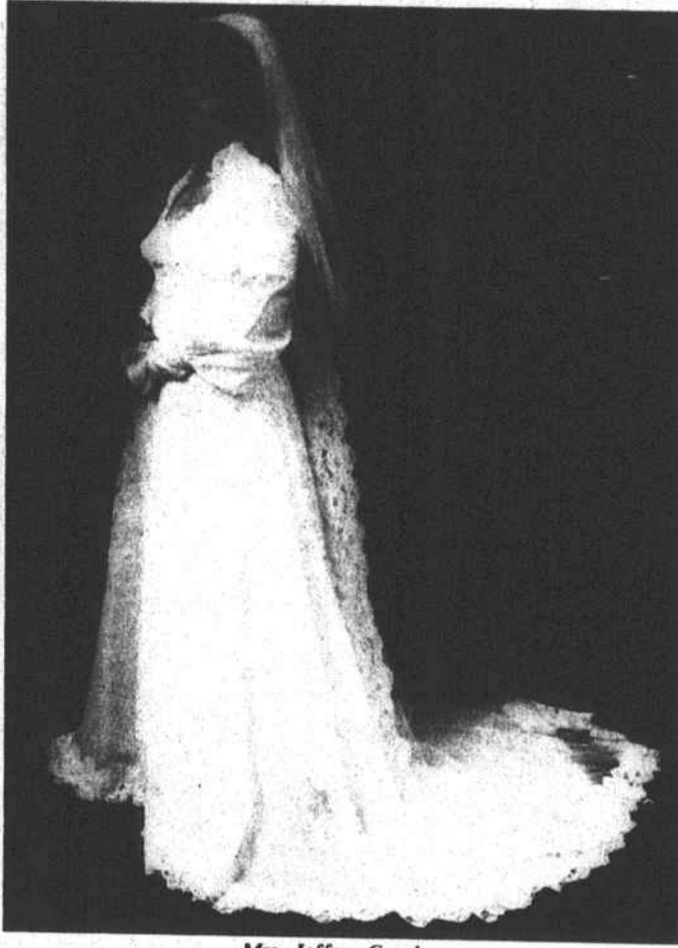
A wedding reception was given by the bride's parents at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Hank Richards, 701 North Main Street.
