#### Hoke students attending ECU

The University of North Carolina at Greensboro has an enrollment of 10,150 this fall, including seven students from Hoke County

Hoke County is among 95 counties in the state that are represented by students at UNC-G during the current academic year.

The five North Carolina counties which do not have students on campus are Clay, Pamlico, Perquimans, Tyrrell and Washington.

The 10,150 students include 7,401 undergraduates and 2,749

graduate students. This year's enrollment represents a slight increase over the 10,090 figure of a year ago.

Class sizes at the undergraduate level are: freshmen, 1,738; sophomores, 1,562; juniors, 1,802; seniors, 1,847; plus special students.

Forty states and the District of Columbia have sent students to UNC-G this year. In addition, 186 students from 54 foreign countries are represented at UNC-G.
