The 11-week course meets on Thrusday nights from 6:30 to 9:15 p.m. at Hoke High from December 5 through February 20.

The 3-hour class combines lecture and demonstration. Through the use of portable keyboards and piano, students will learn music notation and rhythmic patterns. The course involves direct student participation via discussion, demonstrations, and written exercises.

Instructor for the course is Lee Harris who is co-director of music and organ at Raeford Presbyterian Church and music instructor at Flora MacDonald Academy in Red Springs.

Harris holds a Bachelor of Music from Southern Illinois University with further study at the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music. West Virginia University, the University of Evansville, and Frankfort Hochschule fur Musik.
