# 2014 shaping up to be big election year

The first of several election filing periods this year—this one for three seats on the Hoke County Board of Commissioners-will open on February 10 and run until

February 28. The seats currently occupied by commissioners Ellen McNeill, Tony Hunt and Jean Powell are up for election this year. So far, three people – Harry Southerland, Michael Lindsay and Allen Thomas – have announced they plan to seek election to the

commission. All three plan to run as Democrats.

If enough candidates in each party file to run, the county will hold a primary on May 6. Election Day is scheduled for November 4. Three seats on the county

board of education are also up for

election this year. Board members Barbara Buie, Della Maynor and Irish Pickett currently occupy the seats. The filing period for the board of education opens July 7.

The office of the sheriff, currently occupied by Sheriff Hubert Peterkin, and the position of the

county coroner, currently held by G. Franklin Crumpler, are also up for election this year. Peterkin announced in August that he plans to run for office again.

## County hires finance officer

Hoke County's new chief finance officer starts work Monday, according to County Manager Tim Johnson.

After conducting interviews with candidates, the county board of commissioners chose to hire Barry Mayo, the current finance officer for Warren County. Mayo will earn a starting salary of \$89,716. The commission is set to officially confirm Mayo to the position at the first board meeting of the year on January 6.

Mayo graduated from Orange High School in Hillsborough in 1981 and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in business from St. Augustine College in Raleigh in 1985. He went back to school and earned an MPA in public administration from N.C.



#### February:

Parks and Recreation Director Elgin Blue dies just days before he was set to be inducted into the Hoke County High School Sports Hall of

Fame. Parks and Recreation employee Kendrick Maynor later became the new department director.

David Frame, 16, was shot and killed while he and three other people were allegedly attempting to rob the All American Mattress and Furniture store on Highway 211. Deputies arrested Ronald

#### March:

Cape Fear Valley opens its outpatient facility, Health Pavilion Hoke. The facility offers a number of outpatient services such as imaging and doctors' offices.

The House of Raeford announces it is getting out of the turkey business and will shut down the slaughterhouse in Raeford, laying off nearly 1,000 workers. The cook plant will continue to operate. The plant had its final day of operations in July and officials expected the plant would be fully vacated in December. (See LOOKING
