Fourteen Columbus, Ohio, Men Are Arrested and Imprisoned For Participation.

FOUR LOTTERIES FOUND

Columbus, Ohio, April 14.—What is declared by local police officers to be the start of a nation-wide campaign against four big lottery companies operating throughout the country was taken here today when 14 Columbus men were arrested and jailed on charges of selling lottery tickets or operating a lottery. More than \$100,000 worth of lottery tickets were seized, the police say. The four lottery companies are said to be the Hudsons, the Cuban, which is declared to be conducted through the National Bank of the Republic of Cuba, the Metropolitan, whose headquarters are in Montreal, but whose printing establishment is said to be in Toledo, Ohio, and the Atlantic. According to the local police they learned of the alleged lottery when tickets were discovered in a post office and asked him to pay them.
