SLIGHT RACE TROUBLE OVER BURNING A FLAG

Two White Men Killed and Negro Policeman and Other Negroes Wounded

AT SCENE OF THE 1919 RIOTS

Chicago, June 23.—Two white men were killed and a negro policeman and several negroes were wounded in a riot in a part of the Southside, "black belt" following the reported burning of an American flag by a band of negroes who were said to have paraded in the interest of a "back to Africa" movement last night.

The scene of the trouble is in the heart of the Chicago "black belt" where more than 100 white men and blacks were killed in rioting in 1919.

The dead are H. L. Hunt, white, a native-born white man, and a negro, Joseph P. Owens, negro policeman and several other negroes.

The trouble occurred at Thirty-third street and Indiana avenue. Several hundred policemen were rushed to the district and succeeded in restoring order before the disturbance spread.

According to the statements of spectators, the crowd consisted of about 100 men, and that the flag was burned in the presence of the mob.

Police declared tonight that they probably were not the mob which was reported to have burned the flag.
