Bank Debtors Who Ignore Mail Face Serious Trouble

his wish to co-operate with those who owe the bank to the fullest extent, provided they would meet him half way. However, the action of those who have plainly shown, by refusing bank mail, to acknowledge their obligations, means, to his mind, that when they secured money from the institution before it closed, they had no intention of paying it back. "It simply means that we shall take out judgment proceedings against them, and that we won't waste any time about doing it."

In discussing the financial state ments, Mr. Spradlin stated that it was very important that he be furnished with these. He said that by filling out the blanks, the debtor not only helped the bank, but helped himself, for in many in stances the receiver has been able to assist those in an apparently financial chaos to a more firm financial standing.

In conclusion, the receiver stated that those debtors who are making no effort to co-operate with him are not only delaying liquidation but are lenghtening materially the time be-fore a dividend can be paid.
