

Surry Voters Give Lead To Ehringhaus And Morrison; Large Vote

Sparger was given 139 votes and Mullican 233. However complete returns from Surry and Stokes counties show Sparger leading by approximately 1,200 votes.

In the state, practically completed returns show Ehringhaus leading both of his opponents with Maxwell trailing Fountain. The Elizabeth City lawyer was 50,000 votes ahead Wednesday, having received a total of 165,942. Fountain polled 113,112, while Maxwell was low man with 100,875. The total vote cast in the primary as tabulated to date is 379,929, breaking all pre-

vious records in the state.

Although Ehringhaus does not hold a majority and Fountain has the right to ask a second primary, he has made no announcement as yet of his plans. He said he would wait until after the official canvass of the votes.

Returns also show that Reynolds, wet candidate for the senate, is leading Morrison with approximately 12,000 votes, and announcement made Wednesday morning discloses that Bowie will support Reynolds in the second primary. Reynolds claims also that Grist has pledged him his support.

Returns from 1,607 precincts showed that the nomination of A. H. (Sandy) Graham, was assured. Graham polling 177,157. Giles 47,779 and Dellinger, 51,617.

Stacy Wade appeared certain of the nomination for secretary of state and Baxter Durham holds a com-

manding lead for state auditor, Dennis G. Brummitt is practically certain of the nomination for attorney-general, while the race is close between Roy Lawrence and Clarence Mitchell, runner up, for the right to contest A. L. Fletcher, the leader, in the race for commissioner of labor in the second primary.

Stanley Winborne is practically certain of nomination as corporation commissioner, and Dan C. Boney has more than doubled his lead over W. D. Norton for insurance commissioner.

Bank Debtors Who Ignore Mail Face Serious Trouble

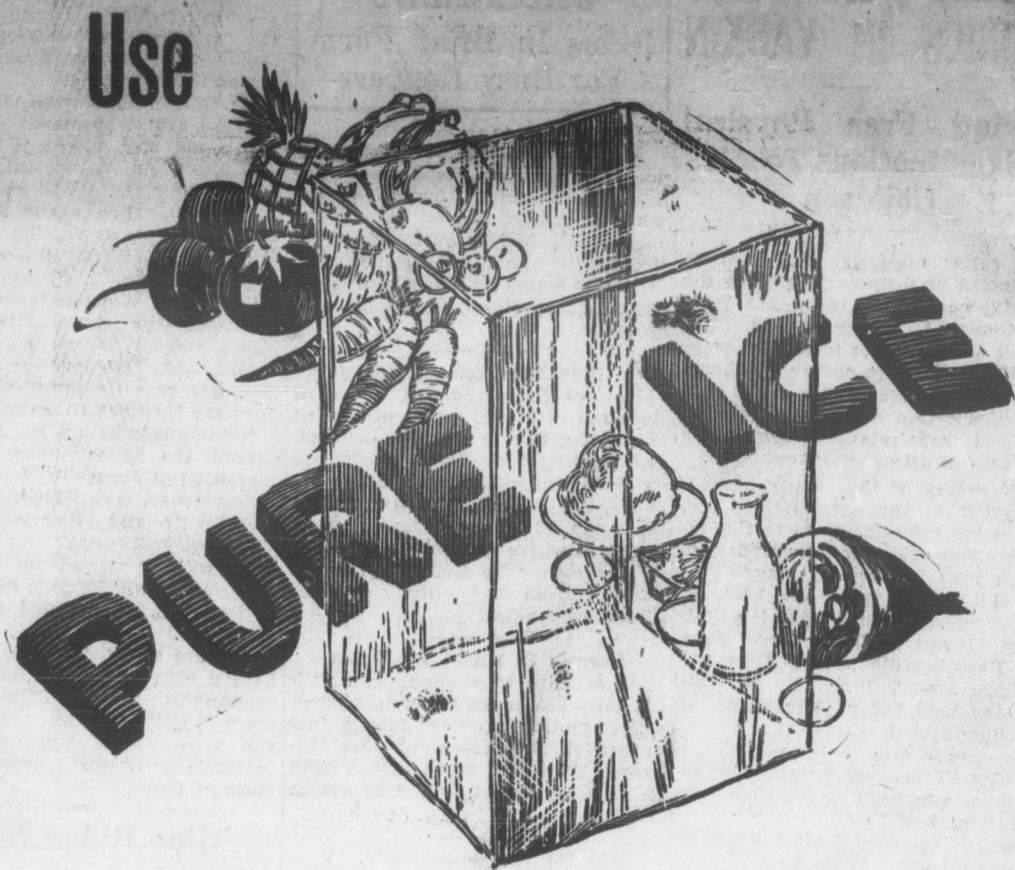

his wish to co-operate with those who owe the bank to the fullest extent, provided they would meet him half way. However, the action of those who have plainly shown, by refusing bank mail, to acknowledge their obligations, means, to his mind, that when they secured money from the institution before it closed, they had no intention of paying it back. "It simply means that we shall take out judgment proceedings against them, and that we won't waste any time about doing it."

In discussing the financial statements, Mr. Spradlin stated that it was very important that he be furnished with these. He said that by filling out the blanks, the debtor not only helped the bank, but helped himself, for in many instances the receiver has been able to assist those in an apparently financial chaos to a more firm financial standing.

In conclusion, the receiver stated that those debtors who are making no effort to co-operate with him are not only delaying liquidation but are lengthening materially the time before a dividend can be paid.

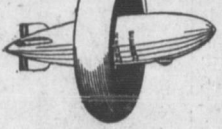
