Attorney John H. Folger, of Mt. Airy, has been appointed a member of the new state school commission, it was revealed Sunday when members of the commission were announced by Governor J. C. B. Ehringhaus.

Mr. Folger, who is the representative of the fifth congressional district-one member being chosen from each district-is also one of six members appointed who have served on the board of equalization, which administered the state's six months school term.

Under the 1933 school law the school commission, of which the governor is ex-officio chairman, the most powerful school administratrive body ever created in the state. It will have practically unlimited power in reaching decisions involving operation of the months school term.
