stances they would have bought in recent years. Bear in mind that just a little more spending by each family in Elkin and vicinity will make all the difference in the world to the business interests of this city.

"It should be borne in mind that this is a nation-wide movement to stimulate buying between now, and the end of the year. This means that our local merchants are not only going to profit by our campaign but our local industries also will derive benefits from the stimulated demand for products manufactured in Elkin. And the agricultural section will be helped, too, because increased business in the cities and towns is bound to create a heavier demand for the things the farmer has to sell."

"We know that business can be greatly stimulated by the plans now being put into effect. Nobody is being asked to make any particular sacrifices. To buy now is manifestly self-interest because prices are bound to go higher. Therefore, I feel that we are simply doing the logical and obvious thing in accepting the Government's invitation to join in the present campaign.

Mr. Armfield stated that every possible medium would be employed to mobilize public opinion. These include display ads, and special articles in newspapers, radio talks, motion pictures, public speakers, posters and stickers. It is the expectation of the N. R. A. that every line of business will be tremendously stimulated during the weeks before the end of the year, and, with this momentum added to the various other phases of the recovery program, the upward economic trend will continue until conditions approximating normal have been reached.
