Chapter 458, Public Laws, authorizes the State School Commission to pay up to \$600 each for children injured or killed in school bus accidents in Surry County during the present closing school year, and provides that if the State School Commission does not pay for such injuries, the County Commissioners may pay the same or any part there-

Chapter 246, Public Laws, sets up the following terms of Superior Court in Surry County: 2nd Monday before 1st Monday in March, 2 weeks for criminal and civil cases; 7th Monday after 1st Monday in March, 2 weeks criminal and civil; 8th Monday before 1st Monday in September, 2 weeks civil; 4th Monday after 1st Monday in September, criminal only; and 5th Monday after

1st Monday in September, civil only. House Bill 613 puts a two year closed season on deer, wild turkey. and ringnecked pheasants in Alle-ghany, Wilkes, Surry and Yadkin counties, and prescribes a penalty of \$100 to \$1000 or 60 days to 2 years for violation. The bill also fixes the penalty of \$5-\$25 or not over 30 days for allowing dogs to chase deer Tomorrow May Bring A or other game in the Roaring Gap and Mitchell River Reservations. Wilkes counties, fishing, except in the Yadkin river, with seines, nets, traps or dynamite, or the placing of sawdust in streams is prohibited under penalty of fine of \$100 to \$500 or 60 days to one year.

II. LAWS AFFECTING CITIES AND TOWNS IN SURRY COUNTY. A. Elkin.

Chapter 67, Private Laws, authorizes the town to issue \$528,250 in refunding bonds, under the provisions of the Local Government and Municipal Finance Acts, to be issued for outstanding principal and interest was not lifelong

House Bill 1298 authorizes the Town to accept bonds in payment of past due taxes and all street assessments, and validates all such acts automobiles within one-hundred and fifty-yards of a hard-surface highway, outside of an incorporated and sidewalk assessments, to \$1.60 and sidewalk assessments, to \$1.60 on the \$100 of property valuation.

Chapter 190, Private Laws, authorzes the Commissioners to accept title to property in lieu of cash payment of taxes and paving assessments when they deem the same equivalent to the value of the property. The Chapter authorizes the Commissioners to sell or lease such property on terms considered to the Town's best interest.


