

EXPANSION IS TO INCLUDE COUNTY

Surry Farmers Ask to Be Added to Tri-Creek Soil Conservation District

ARE TO HOLD HEARINGS

Last winter the first steps were taken by land-owners in Yadkin county to have a Soil Conservation District established for the purpose of setting up an organization of farmers for the control of soil erosion and for other conservation work. The State Soil Conservation Committee, after conferring with representative farmers of the county, decided on those portions drained by North and South Deep and Forbush Creeks. The included area was the central portion of Yadkin county and the name—Tri-Creek—was derived from the fact that the area was drained by the three above mentioned streams. A referendum was conducted to determine whether farmers wished to set up a district. At this election the land-owners voted unanimously in favor of the establishment of the district.

On January 7, 1939 a group of Surry county farm owners asked, by petition, that this county also be added to Tri-Creek District. may become better informed on this proposition the State Committee has published the following notice:

NOTICE of Hearings Upon the Expansion of Tri-Creek Soil Conservation District to Include all of Surry County.

WHEREAS, on January 7, 1939,

there was duly filed in the office of the State Soil Conservation Committee at Raleigh, North Carolina, a petition signed by at least 25 landowners, pursuant to the provisions of the Soil Conservation Districts Law (Chap. 393 Public Laws, 1937) requesting the inclusion of Surry County within the established Tri-Creek Soil Conservation District, and

WHEREAS, the lands to be added to said district by said petition comprise lands in Surry county described substantially as follows:

All of the area included within the boundary of Surry County, excepting and excluding town and village lots, and lands owned by or under control of the United States or any of its agencies.

NOW, THEREFORE, Notice is hereby given that public hearings and discussions will be held pursuant to the said petition on the question of the desirability and necessity in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare, for the expansion of said district to include Surry County; upon the propriety of the petition and of all other proceedings taken under the said Act; on the question of the appropriate boundaries to be assigned to the enlarged district, and upon all questions relevant to such inquiries. The said public hearings and discussions will be held by the State Committee, or its representatives, as follows:

Shoals School February 14, 2:00 P. M., Copeland School February 14, 7:00 P. M., Mountain Park School February 15, 2:00 P. M., Franklin School February 15, 7:00 P. M., Cooke School February 16, 2:00 P. M., Dobson Court Room February 16, 7:00 P. M.

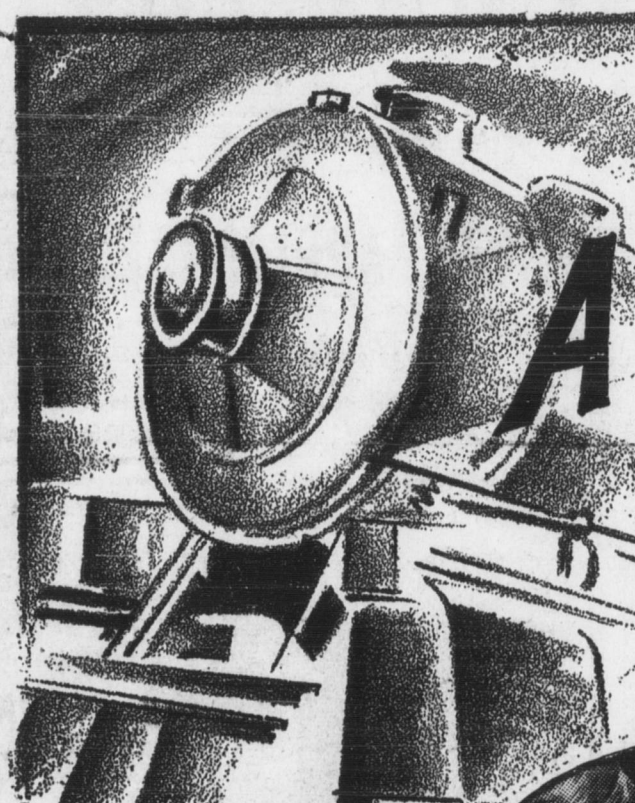

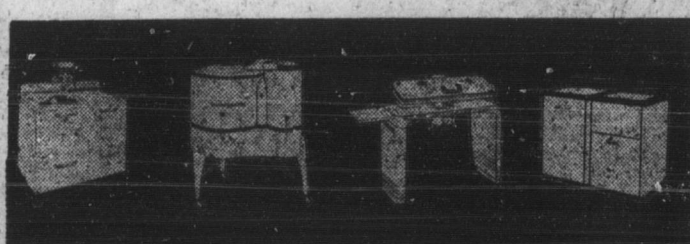
