Miss Mattie Motsinger of Winston-Salem, spent the 'week-end with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. Lee Motsinger.

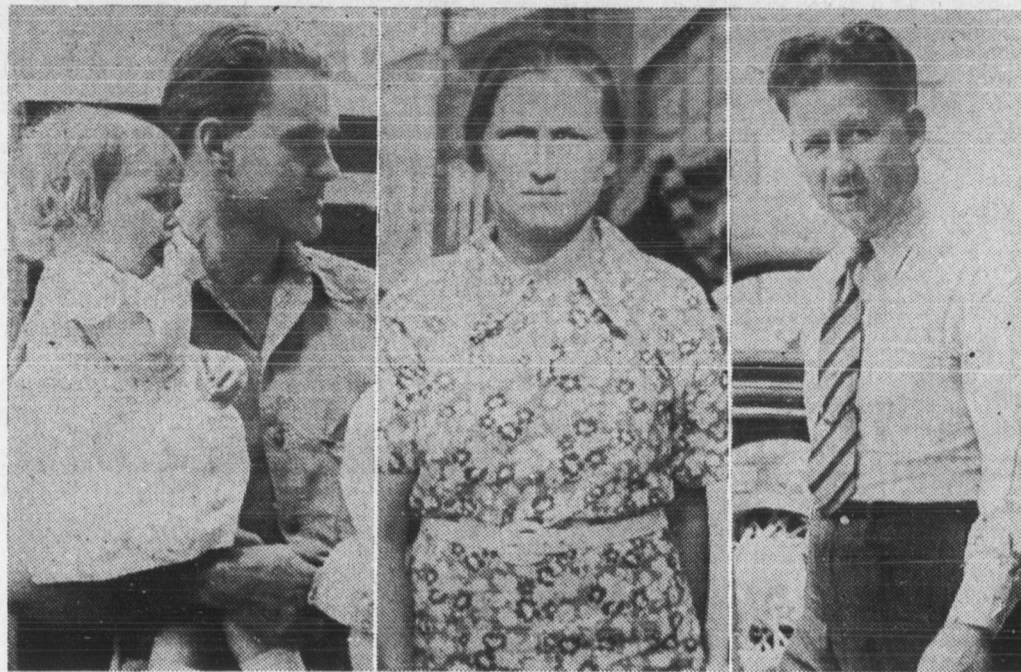
Misses Sadie Fleming and Myrtle Bolick visited Miss Bolick's mother at Franklin, in the western part of the state, last Friday and Saturday.
