### Passes Away in Elkin Hospital Following Critical Illness

### BURIED AT BOONVILLE

Attended by a throng of people that taxed the capacity of the church, funeral services were held Friday morning at 11 o'clock from Boonville Methodist church for James Ralph Fletcher, 37, of Boonville and Elkin. The rites were in charge of Rev. J. H. Greene, pastor of the deceased, assisted by Rev. J. P. Davis.

Mr. Fletcher passed away in the local hospital late Wednesday afternoon following a critical illness.

The deceased was a son of Mr. and Mrs. W. T. Fletcher, of Boonville, and was a member of the Boonville Methodist church. He was a young man of sterling character and was admired by a host of friends. For several years he had been associated with Chatham Manufacturing company of this city as foreman.

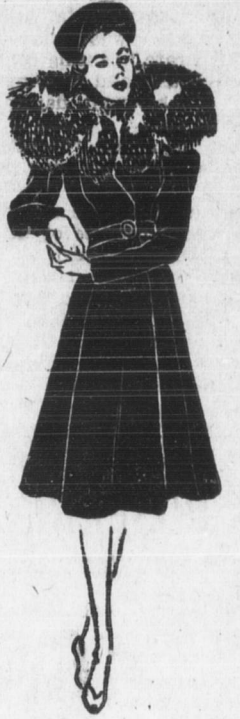
