INFANTILE PARALYSIS CASE IS REPORTED

One case of poliomyelitis, infantile paralysis, has developed in Fall Creek township, Yadkin county, according to a statement by Dr. J. Roy Hege, county health officer.

Dr. Hege said that every precaution is being taken to prevent the spread of the disease. The family has been quarantined and persons who have had contact with the diseased person or his family are being held out of school and public gatherings until it has been safely determined that they are not carrying the germs, Dr. Hege said.

The polio sufferer is James Matthews, about 20 years old.

It is the second time polio has developed in the same family, Dr. Hege said, but added that there was no indication of any connection between the two cases, as the first case developed several years ago.


