

Washington, Washington prognosticators, who usually come closest to guessing picked Attorney-General Frank Murphy as the President's most likely choice for the Supreme Court as soon as the news came out that Associate Justice Pierce Butler had passed on.

The choice of Mr. Murphy seems logical for several reasons. For one thing, it is geographically right; Mr. Murphy hails from Michigan, which is in the same section of the nation as Justice Butler's home in Minnesota, as Washington looks at the political map. Then Mr. Murphy is a Roman Catholic and so was Justice Butler. Not that the question of religious beliefs has ever counted for much in picking Supreme Court nominees, but as the court is now constituted it contains one Jew and seven Protestants and not a single Catholic. Justice Butler was the only one of that faith to sit on the high bench after the late Chief Justice White ances, Mr. Murphy is held by preme Court decisions, the three died.
