
JURY FINDS SCHOOL BUSES NEED REPAIRS

INTERNATIONAL

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS, Namsos, Norway—Six waves of German planes bombed this British landing base for 10 hours yesterday with a heavy toll of life and the destruction of a British destroyer which was left a blazing shell. The German planes, before flying away from the bombing at-tack, were alleged to have ma-chine-gunned civilians in the streets. The big, swastika-marked Nazi bombers swept upon the city and port in six separate attacks between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

STOCKHOLM—Allied forces last night battled along the Gudbrands Valley of central Norway to escape being driven back to the seacoast by sledgehammer German drives which were reported to have linked Oslo to Trondheim and closed a steel vise on two Allies bases. Germany's motorized war machine, pounding ahead with tremendous strides, appeared on the basis of German claims to be repeating the "blitz-krieg" tactics which carried it


