

ALL DOGS MUST BE VACCINATED

J. A. Eads, Surry County Rabies Inspector, Announces Schedule

MUST PAY FEE OF 50c

In accordance with the act to prevent rabies in this state, which requires vaccination of all dogs, J. A. Eads, Surry county rabies inspector, has announced the following schedule for the vaccination of dogs:

Marsh township, May 16 and 23: Fairview 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.; Frank Jenkins' Store, 9:15 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.; Crutchfield Postoffice, 11:15 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.; Little Richmond School, 1:15 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.; Burch Station, 3:15 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.; Twin Oaks Service Station, 4:45 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Elkin township, May 17 and 24: Greenwood Service Station, 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.; Sinclair Ser-Station, Elkin, 9:15 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.; Davis' Store, North Elkin, 3:15 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Bryan township, May 20 and 27: Kapp's Mill, 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.; Mountain Park Postoffice, 9:15 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.; Walter Simmons' Store, 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.; Snow's Store at Zephyr, 3:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

On other dates Mr. Eads may be seen at his home. The fee for vaccination is 50 cents, unless it is necessary for the inspector to go to the home of the dog owner. In such cases the fee is 75 cents.

Nov. 21, 1940, the third Thursday instead of the last Thursday of the month, has been designated Thanksgiving Day by President Roosevelt.

Re-listing in Surry Convenience To Its Farmers

Whereas many North Carolina counties are calling for a complete new registration in order to be eligible to vote in the approaching primary and election, Surry county voters, if they cast a ballot in the elections of 1936 and 1938 do not have to go to the trouble of registering again.

The state ruling on the re-listing or re-registration of voters left the matter optional with the board of elections in various counties, and R. A. Freeman, of Dobson, chairman of the Surry board of elections, has pointed out that Surry election officials chose to order the registrars to work out a new list themselves in order to save time for the county's farmers, now in the midst of their busy planting season.

An entirely new registration for every citizen would have made it necessary for every citizen to take time off from work and hunt up a registrar, whereas the re-listing falls on the registrars and members of the county board of elections alone. The re-listing takes care of all voters who voted in either the primary or general election in 1936 or 1938. Others must re-register.

The Surry registration books were open Saturday, April 6, and will remain open through next Saturday.
