The \$500,000,000 new warships order was the biggest in navy history. It covered 11 cruisers, the chaperones, Dr. and Mrs. 20 destroyers, 13 submarines and a large seaplane tender. The contracts were closed without

competitive bidding, as authorized by the new speed-up legisla-tion which President Roosevelt signed just two hours earlier. Other departments kept the preparedness pace.
