

EDUCATOR DIES WEDNESDAY PM

Prof. Dan W. Martin Passes Away Following Brief Illness

FUNERAL HELD FRIDAY

Prof. W. Dan Martin, 86, well known Yadkin county educator, died at the Yadkin clinic at Yadkinville Wednesday night following a brief illness. He suffered a paralytic stroke on Saturday and his condition grew steadily worse until his death.

Mr. Martin was a native of Yadkin county and a life-long resident of the county. He was well known for his educational work. Beginning first as a teacher in the county schools, he later served three different terms as county superintendent of schools. In the 1919 session he served as librarian of the state senate.

He was twice married, first to Miss Mollie Gough, and after her death to Mrs. Mollie Steelman Shore, who survives him, with six sons, Dr. Floyd Martin, Dunn; Grover Martin, Smithfield attorney; Dr. W. T. Martin, of Raleigh; Dr. James A. Martin, of Lumberton; Clyde Martin, of Lillington, and Dwight D. Martin, principal of Fall Creek school, Yadkin county; one daughter, Miss Leona Martin, Hamptonville. Funeral services were held Fri-

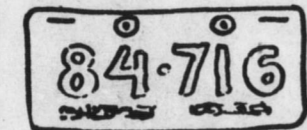

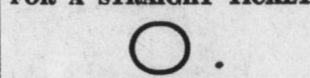
Voters May Split Ticket or Vote Straight Through for Democrats or Republicans

3—If you tear or deface or wrongly mark this ballot return it and get another.

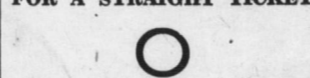

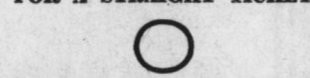

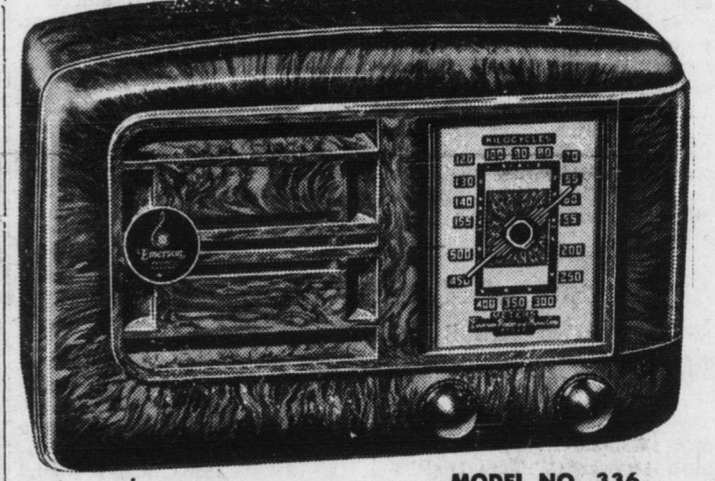
