Don W. Cochrane, Jr., of Route 1, State Road, has made application to receive instruction in the artificial breeding course to be taught at State College beginning November 7.


Cochrane, a farmer and student in the Veterans Farmer Training class at Mountain Park, will serve as an artificial inseminator when he completes his training.
