

BIG MILL IS THREATENED BY FIRE TODAY

Veneer Department and Boiler Room Completely Destroyed

DAMAGE WILL REACH \$10,000

The large plant of the Greenville Cooperage and Lumber Company barely escaped being totally destroyed by fire this afternoon about 2 o'clock when the veneer department of the company was burned to the ground.

It occurring at such a late hour we were unable to gather all particulars of the blaze, other than it caught from the conveyor running under the floor from the boiler and fire room into the factory, which carried the heat into the mill where the veneering was shelved for drying.

The mill being six or seven blocks from the fire district and water supply, the fire copy was helped as far as furnishing water to extinguish the blaze. The wind was very high, and the timber being dry it required only a few minutes for the blaze to get beyond the control of those fighting to save the building.

The damage done will reach \$10,000 but is nearly covered by insurance.

Mr. Frizzell Will Not Oppose Abernethy.

The political situation in this Judicial District, so far as the race for the office of Solicitor is concerned has become simplified by the announcement of Mr. Frizzell to the editor of this paper that he has no intention to enter the race for that office against the present incumbent the Hon. Charles L. Abernethy, and that he will not be a candidate.

Mr. Frizzell it is known, at first listened to the suggestions of several that he become a candidate, but after considering the matter finally concludes not to permit his name to be used in this connection.

The friends of Mr. Abernethy in Greene and adjoining counties are pleased to know that Mr. Abernethy's nomination and re-election is now assured.

The elimination of Mr. Frizzell from the race gives Greene county still to Abernethy.

The expressions of approval reaching us are to the effect that no public officer in recent years in this county and Judicial District is deserving of more credit for the efficient manner in which the duties pertaining to the office have been performed than the highly courageous manner in which every call of office has been made. Mr. Abernethy, Virile, forceful, a good lawyer, the people have always had a good advocate in him in the presentation of the criminal laws.

Mr. Abernethy has been consistent and unyielding in his determination to uphold the law as it is written into the statutes of our State without regard to friend or foe whenever he was convinced that the accused was guilty. When satisfied that guilt did not exist we venture to say that no collector in the State has withstood and resisted the demands and pressure of private counsel and interested parties for prosecution with more firmness and resolution than has Mr. Abernethy. He has won the office to which the people of this District elected him for the sole purpose of preventing any one whom he was satisfied was guilty of the crime as charged.

Confident in the discharge of the office at this time, disinterestedly, and with the ability of prosecuting attorney necessarily belongs in its performance, fearless in opposition when duty was to be considered clean and ethical in the real of his work, the people of this District are to be congratulated that Mr. Abernethy seeks nomination and re-election to the office now so capably filled on the 14th, and since so people know and appreciate a good thing when they have it, it is fortunate that in this case they can hold on to their good officer who has been tried and not found wanting.—Greene County Square Deal.

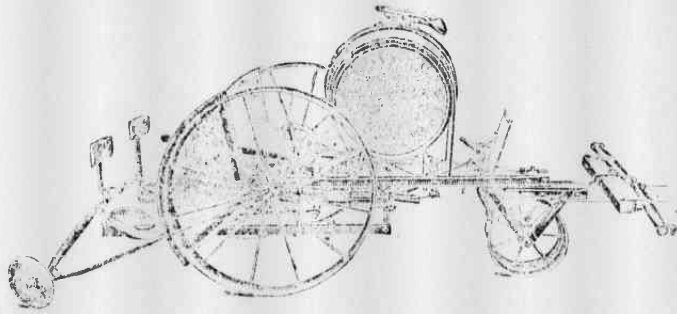
