Ohio Has Unique Convict Brick Plant
Columbus, Ohio, August 22.—Other states have convicts working in honor squads on roads or employ them in penitentiary shops, but it remained for Ohio to establish a model factory system for convicts. This plant going full blast today, is not within the penitentiary walls. It is at a little place called Goble, a few miles from here. There 70 prisoners work six days a week making bricks. No guard stands by to see that they do not make their escape. They are alone—except for 10 skilled brick-makers, all employed by the State, who direct the work.
The men live in a big dormitory by

themselves. They have a baseball diamond nearby and a small baseball league has been organized among the 70 prisoners. But their favorite diversion is in holding a mock trial. They take delight in addressing the jury and in giving ponderous judicial decisions.
The capacity of the plant is 20,000 paving bricks or 45,000 building brick a day. Five more kilns are to be built and more prisoners will be sent to work on the plant. The entire output is used by the state. Expenses of the plant, outside of pay to the men employed and the amounts allowed to the prisoners, consists almost entirely of food and fuel bills. It costs \$500 a month to feed the men.

Bishop Strange was fifty-seven years of age and was beloved not only by those of the Episcopal church but by other religious bodies as well throughout the State.

The obsequies will take place Tuesday afternoon in Wilmington.

At a meeting of the Pitt County Board of Elections held in the Court House of Pitt County, on Monday, August 10, 1914, a new precinct known as Fountain Precinct, with voting place at Fountain, N. C., was created by said board. The description and boundaries of said new precinct are as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at Baker's Mill where the public road crosses the Wilson county line, and thence with the Farmville road to B. F. Tugwell's Fork of the road; thence with the public road from B. F. Tugwell's to Washington Smith, including the farms of Washington Smith, R. A. Parker and Edward Smith; thence with public road from Washington Smith's to Marcellus Smith; thence with public road from Marcellus Smith to W. C. Edwards store at the Edgecombe county line; thence with the Pitt county line to the Wilson county line to the beginning.

Therefore, let all persons and parties take notice of the above act of the said County Board of Elections and abide by the same.
