The gay dress of the North American Indian created a profound impression upon the early spectators, and their marks are filled with accounts of the brilliant attire of the red man.

In giving Hiawatha, the P. E. Literary Society has spared no expense nor effort to reproduce this picturesque part of the life of a primitive race. The dresses of the women are richly embroidered with strange beads and sprangles, and decorated with fringe and feathers. Adorned with chains of pearl and gold beads, with bracelets for their necks and arm bangles of shining shells, and glittering bands around their foreheads they make a charming color study as they walk in stately procession at the wedding of Hiawatha and Minnehaha.

No less attractive are the warriors. In all the glory of their war bonnets and plumes, their pipes and calumets adorned with combings of the crane, their bows and arrows and their arrowheads around their waists.

A most interesting feature of this pageant of the children will be their dress and games native to the older people.

In this pageant of Hiawatha, the Indian customs and historic events in Indian life are given in a picturesque manner, and the evening of Dec. 7, should be one of the most delightful events of the season.

## American Troops Leave Vera Cruz Today After Seven Months Stay in Mexico

Washington, D. C., Nov. 22.—General Pershing's military and marine headquarters today left Vera Cruz, Mexico, after a seven months stay in the Mexican port in accordance with the instructions from President Wilson.

The five battalions at Vera Cruz and Tampico and the string of vessels on the West coast will remain in Mexican waters to afford protection to Americans and to be ready to meet emergencies.

It was just seven months ago when the blue-jackets and marines, under their Admiral Fletcher sailed Vera Cruz as an act of reprisal for a report to the American flag at Tampico, where a boat load of American Marines were arrested. General Huerta, who controlled the port at Tampico, had refused to comply with the demand of Admiral Maffei for a salute of 21 guns.

Advises from Mexico today were confusing, but the American government's determination is to withdraw its troops and to remove from Mexican territory a possible cause of international friction as well as a potential factor that might become a domestic issue between factions in Mexico.

Carries Out Mobile Speech.  
President Wilson is hopeful that evacuation of Vera Cruz will be an enduring demonstration of the purpose of the United States announced in its mobile speech a year ago to seek no territorial aggrandizement south of the Rio Grande. He believes continued presence of American troops on Mexican soil would be misinterpreted throughout Latin America.

In withdrawing from Mexican soil the United States has taken pains that no action shall be recognized as a precedent in regard to the evacuation and in pleasing the patients requested by the Washington government. General Huerta has no orders to receive the troops of Vera Cruz to any part of the country. His restrictions are strictly for the purpose of the evacuation. He will not allow any American troops to enter any part of Mexico, except to receive the troops of the United States.

How To Teach Athens Is Topic.  
Athens, N. Y., Nov. 21.—The problem of the education of the immigrant in America will be the topic of discussion at the convention of the New York State Teachers' Association which opens here tomorrow. Tomorrow session will be given over entirely to the subject, for the association members believe the work is hardly begun and that the serious nature of the problem is scarcely realized. At least 100,000 immigrants are entering the country each year in New York City, will provide.

### THE FRANK'S LAWYER

IN SUPREME COURT.

Washington, Nov. 22.—In the hands of Justice Lamar of the United States supreme court rests the question whether that court will interfere in the case of Leo M. Frank, of Atlanta, and save the alleged murderer of Mary Phagan from paying the just penalty.

Arguments were made to the justice at his home here today by Henry Peoples and Harry Alexander, lawyers of Atlanta. They were assisted by Louis Marshall, a constitutional expert of New York.

The federal question upon which Frank's lawyers ask Justice Lamar to grant the writ of error to act as a legal examination of the penalty given, the method employed in the trial, it was alleged when Frank was not in the court room when the verdict was returned and he was thereby denied his constitutional right.

At a late hour last night there was every indication that Justice Lamar would render no decision until some time next week.
