A RAILROAD COLLISION.—Dispatches from Mess. Peter P. Yates and A. C. Mendenhall, who left here on the 9:40 train last night, announce a fearful collision this morning at or near Orange Court House, Va., on the Midland Railroad. Both of them are safe, but a number were badly hurt. No further particulars.

The rain last night was quite heavy. There were two distinct showers, followed by a third, which was far less abundant. From the pelting, roaring sound of the down-pouring rain it may be supposed that bridges and culverts suffered considerably.

ANOTHER DOG DONE FOR.—Constable Lyon informed us last night of the shooting of a small spitz dog yesterday evening that exhibited the rabies on Forbis street. From the vigilance of our attentive police it is not apprehended that mad dogs will multiply to much extent within our limits.

FOR DIVORCE.—Surprising information was communicated here this morning: As one of our prominent citizens, accompanied by his wife, was about to enter the court house door, and a lady of their acquaintance was passing near enough to see them going in, the gentleman in question, turning on his heel for a moment, made a trumpet of his fiat and blew from it these notes: "Going for Divorce." There will be a Teachers' Conference at Siler City, on Monday, Aug. 29th, to hold until Sept. 3rd. Profs. Blair, of Winston, and McIver, of Raleigh, are expected to be in attendance, also County Supt. Meredith, of Chatham. Principal Thompson, of the school at Siler, who was here this morning, reports that the institution opened on the 10th inst., with a goodly number of matriculates, 70 odd being enrolled up to the present, with a good prospect for over one hundred.
