Mr. J. W. Scott was among the excursionists to Dalton yesterday. He came back well pleased with his visit. His estimate of the crowd present at Dalton was at from 2000 to 3000. Mr. Scott, of course, met a number of his customers, and Mr. Graves, who was along with his samples, was ready to take orders—and took them. Mr. H. C. Coe, who lives near Dalton, not only runs a store, but a house of entertainment also, at which the traveller finds excellent accommodations at a low price.

This morning in the trial of Hairston for the murder of Charles Blackburn, Judge Ruffin, for the prosecution, announced that the evidence would not warrant the State in asking for a verdict of murder, and after consultation with the counsel for the defence, who were willing to submit to a plea of manslaughter, the State had concluded to let the case take such a course with the court's approval. The court announced its entire confidence in the counsel for the prosecution and ordered that a verdict of manslaughter should be entered on the record. Hairston will be sentenced next week.
