The columns of a newspaper represent the stock in trade of the proprietor-his means of livelihood-and to ask him to give away his space, for which he has to pay the printer to fill, is an injustice and imposition upon a generons, home-loving class of citizens -the editors of our land-who are entitled to more considerate treatment and better things at the hands of their people.—Gold Leaf.

Jury Reform in the New States.

The new constitution of both the Dakotas pave way the for an important reform in the jury system. . They empower the Legislature to provide that in civil cases verdiets may be rendered by threefourths of the jurors.

That is an innovation which might be copied with advantage in the older States. The principal of unanimity that now prevails is a relic of the past which might be dispensed with in both civil and oriminal cases.

It is, moreover, a striking anomaly. In no other body is a unanimous vote required to decide a

mous vote required to decide a question. In every legislative, judical, political or corporation meeting the gravest issues are disposed of by a majority or two-thirds vote. If the same practice were introduced into the jury system there would be fewer miscarriages of justice and more certainty of celerity in both criminal prosecutions and civil literation.
