

HE growth and progress of North Carolina last year was strikingly reflected in the large investment in additions and extensions to the telephone system

Such an active year of construction has rarely been experienced in the State, and, as a result, the telephone service is more extensive and more valuable than ever before.

In North Carolina last year the telephone workers handled 21,149 telephone stations, making a net gain of 6,227 new telephones and involving gross additions to plant of approximately

To accomplish this bg task required the services of 1,257 workers, whose annual wage bill was \$1,449,620.

The investment in service in North Carolina as of Decem her 31, 1924, was \$8,127,364, and there are now 55,250 Bell telephones in the State.

Some of the items included in the investment are 32 central offices, 141,305 miles of wire, 1,872 miles of pole line and 140 miles of underground duct.




